The photography collective will welcome guests and international bidders to their live auction where six prints from this year's 24Photography exhibition, which are currently on public display in Soho Square, London will be on sale.

The archival quality digital prints (50cm x 50cm), will go under the hammer at 19:00 to fundraise for Emilia Clarke's charity SameYou, who are helping to increase neuro-rehabilitation access after brain injury and stroke.

Emilia said when launching SameYou: "I know from personal experience that the support you receive when you leave hospital can have a huge impact on your recovery. Young adults in particular face immense challenges trying to rebuild their lives. Not everyone is able to make a full recovery after brain injury or stroke, but I believe that everyone should have access to the best possible mental and physical rehabilitation to maximise their individual recovery potential."

Claire Spreadbury, founder of 24Photography, said: "We are delighted to be helping a charity that is dedicated to increasing access to rehabilitation services after brain injury and stroke for young people, and hope our auction can go some small way in trying to help."

About 24 Photography

Seventeen years ago 24 photographers set out on an ambitious journey: to document New Year's Day for the next 24 years. To begin, each was allocated one hour of the day during which to record what was going on around them. But the project did not stop there. This was a project that was to last 24 years, with each photographer progressing one hour every year, so that at the end of 24 years, there will be 24 sets of images from New Year's Day. Or 576 images.

The original 24 photographers met while studying on a postgraduate photography course at Central St Martin's in London. Although their various careers have all led them down different paths they reunite to continue towards their goal.

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About SameYou

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SameYou, founded by actor Emilia Clarke, launched in March 2019. The charity aims to transform brain injury recovery for young adults and the provision of services worldwide, focusing on integrated brain, body and mind recovery care. 1 in 3 people will have an acquired brain injury at some point in their life. This is almost double the amount of people that will develop dementia. SameYou is campaigning for an urgent revolution in recovery care after brain injury and stroke.
